The race is 13.1 miles over an anticlockwise loop passing through Leckhampstead, Wicken and Akeley; the starting and finishing point is the Scout Hut on the Playing Fields. 2 Parish Council Actions

The first quarter of 2024 has been extremely busy for the Parish Council, one of our main tasks was to secure Section 106 funding from the Lodge Park development on the outskirts of Maids Moreton, amounting to £67,889. Section 106 monies are an amount of money that a developer agrees to pay, based on the size and number of properties being built; these monies are usually paid to Buckinghamshire Council prior to development commencing. The Section 106 agreement will normally state what these funds can be used for and where they can be spent, in our case improvements to our Scout Hut and Cricket Pavilion only.

We have decided to use the bulk of the money available on the Scout Hut, as this building has been neglected for many years and only used by the Scouts. Our intention is to make the building into a Community Hub and an improved home for the Scouts. It will have a new kitchen, which will enable the Scouts to provide hot food to its groups and the building will also be available for private hire once all the renovations are complete.

It is our intention to replace the roof in early July, with an insulated product reducing the building's CO2 emissions considerably and saving on heating bills in the future. The main hall will benefit from a complete refit along with new flooring, which will follow through from the hall flooring that was replaced after our flood in 2022. Contractors have been lined up to start with the kitchen being fitted on the 26 April 2024. The main building works will be carried out during July and August when the Scouts are enjoying outside activities such as summer camps.

Our new Councillor, Malcom Sayers, is heading up a Speed Watch team and has 12 people who are keen to assist him. You will have seen Speed Watch signs going up on lampposts followed by our teams using a speed camera in different parts of Maids Moreton. The first recording on 22 March found 5% of traffic was exceeding the speed limit by a considerable margin. Offending motorists will receive a letter from the police informing them that they were observed speeding.

You will also see that a new oak post with fingers pointing in three directions has been erected to replace the rotten one opposite the rose garden. We contacted *Men in Sheds*, who gave us a very competitive quote and they have now installed the fingers so that we can all find our way to the pub - and other places as well, of course!

Our annual parish meeting will be on 22 May 2024 after which there will be refreshments kindly provided by our WI volunteers. Please come along and find out what your Parish Council and other groups actually do for your village and, of course, join us for tea and delicious cakes.

3 Planning and Development

Neighbourhood Plan

After the very strong referendum result in favour of our Neighbourhood Plan, Buckinghamshire Council formally made the Plan on 16 February 2024. The Plan will be reviewed in due course and will need to be revised when the new Buckinghamshire Local Plan, which will supersede the current Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan, is made. In anticipation of this, we are continuously updating the Background Document and other relevant material so that this next iteration of our MMNP will be a less time-consuming challenge. This will involve village-wide consultation as the new Buckinghamshire Local Plan emerges.

Scott's Lane Fields (23/01306/APP)

We are still waiting for this application to be determined by the Planning Officer. As you have already been notified, in the event it were to be approved, MMPC has requested the recommendation for approval be called in to the North Bucks Area Planning Committee.

Walnut Drive – Reserved Matters – (23/01636/ADP)

Following the public consultation on 24 January, DWH is working on a set of revised plans. These had not been posted when we went to press but a message will be sent out to those on our mailing list and posted on Facebook when they do appear.

It is good to see the focused and non-emotional objections raised by residents on planning applications, which planning officers should follow up.

Moreton Rd 3

The planning inspector appointed by the Secretary of State to review this application concluded that it should go ahead. This decision is certainly disappointing for Buckingham, and for us. There are many negative aspects that have been allowed to go through unremarked that we feel justified more detailed attention and revision, such as traffic and access into town.

Buckingham Rugby Club Spring Update 2024

Spring is officially here, the men's 6N is done and dusted, the women's 6N has only just begun and sadly, Buckingham's 2023-24 rugby season is almost over! Buckingham men's First XV have had a good season having won 11 matches and they currently sit 5th in Counties 1 Southern North, with 2 games to go. Next up are games against Grove at home on 23rd March and away to bottom of the table Milton Keynes on 6th April. Cup fixtures follow in April to see out the rest of the season.

The Swans Ladies First XV won 9 of their 16 games overall and finished a creditable 4th in their league, which is the level below the Premiership. Since Christmas, they have won an impressive 36 out of 40 possible points, beating the likes Worcester Women and Novocastrians Ladies away, with only a narrow defeat 24-31 against ultimate league winners Cheltenham Tigers Women at home. They will play either Bletchley or ONs in the Women's Alliance Cup at Franklin's Gardens on 15th May. All local support is welcome.

On 10th March, both the BRUFC U15 and U16 boys won their respective County Plate competitions at Bletchley RUFC, despite torrential rain and muddy conditions throughout. The BRUFC U15 boys put in an awesome performance to deliver the perfect Mother's Day gift for their rugby mums with a solid 34-5 win over Chesham. The BRUFC U16s produced a well-deserved 33-10 win over Milton Keynes/Bletchley. What a fantastic way for the U16 players to end their time in the Mini & Junior sections of Buckingham rugby club. Massive congratulations go to both teams.

We have recently awarded the contract for the build of the 2 new CRs, with construction starting with groundwork preparation in April, building to start in earnest in May with completion in time for the start of the new season. Meanwhile planning is well underway for the 12th Buckingham Beer and Music Festival, which will be held on the 5th and 6th July. The music line up has been announced and over 75 real ales and ciders will be on offer. Following last year's success, the Rotary Club of Buckingham will be bringing back their Classic Car show with over 100 rare breeds to feast your eyes on. All Maids Moreton residents will be very welcome!


