

Speedwatch and Thames Valley Police

We have had a summer recess with our Speedwatch campaign and now starting our sessions at various locations within the village again as from Friday 19th September.

With the successful installation of CCTV cameras at the Community Building, this is proving to be a very valuable asset, helping to protect the area and identifying vehicles and individuals using the car park and picnic tables at all sorts of times of the night. With our local Thames Valley Police officers also patrolling the area, we hope this is a clear deterrent to any would be mischievous activity in the area going forward.

2 Parish Council Actions

We regret that Graham Maw has stepped down from the Council for personal reasons. He has done a great deal for us during his time with us, most notably the tight oversight of the new play park and, the rehabilitation of the Scout Hut to provide our new Community Building. We are most appreciative of all that was done to improve our facilities and wish both him and Tracey well for the future. Buckinghamshire Council has advertised the vacancy after which we shall co-opt a replacement Councillor, unless an election is required.

The weather was not on our side for the Summer Play Event on 4th August. Despite this, a good number of children and parents bravely came along. The young team from Milton Keynes Play Association gave us amazing commitment and showed excellent flexibility to ensure that those who did come along enjoyed themselves.

The Tuesday café at the Community Building continues to be well supported and we have had good feedback from those who have sampled what it offers in terms of drinks, eats and company. Clare, Linda and Tracey continue to provide hot and cold drinks as well as a wonderful selection of baking. Our thanks to the three of you as well as to the occasional helpers who have kindly volunteered to come along and help when needed.

2 Planning and Development

Buckinghamshire Council has started work on a new, county-wide local plan that will run until 2045, probably starting in 2027. It has been prepared in two parts: <code>Part A - The Local Plan vision</code> and objectives, the spatial strategies for housing and employment, including ways to meet travelling communities' accommodation needs and <code>Part B - Development Management Policies</code>. The draft Local Plan documents, accompanying Sustainability Appraisal, the completed evidence studies, and details on how to respond to the consultation can be viewed at: https://www.buckinghamshire.gov.uk/draft-local-plan. A virtual exhibition room is available to view at: https://buckinghamshire.oc2.uk/exhibition/1. The consultation closes at 23:59 on 19 October. We shall respond and, if you would like help or advice on commenting, please email phardcastle@maids-moreton.co.uk.

If you submit comments on a planning application in the village, it would be very helpful to let us have a copy as we can no longer view these on the planning portal.

The two Judicial Reviews on the Walnut Drive application will be heard together on 14, 15 and 16 October at the Royal Courts of Justice in The Strand.


