# 2 Parish Council Actions

2023 was a very difficult year for both the Parish Council and our parishioners with soaring energy costs. The Parish Council saw its street light costs rise from around £400 per month to over £700 per month. This, along with the increased cost of gas, also saw the running costs of the Scout Hut and Cricket Pavilion soar.

The Scout Hut suffered severe flood damage in December 2022 which resulted in an insurance claim and repairs were not completed until the summer of 2023. We have taken measures to try and make sure that this does not happen again by bringing all water pipes below ceiling level protecting them from frost damage.

On the brighter side, we were able to finally open our new children's playground on the 4 August 2023, thanks to a grant from FCC and Buckingham Community Board. This project was the culmination of four years hard work from your councillors and their support staff. The playground is now able to be used all the year round, and was designed for children aged from 2 to 12.

On the 4 August, we also held our annual Play Around The Parish event that thanks to the good weather attracted nearly 200 children of all ages plus some parents and grandparents. We hope to continue this as an annual event.

Our annual firework display attracted an even larger crowd this year, as it did not fall on the same night as other local events. We managed to collect nearly £700 in our buckets, which went some way to covering the expenditure of £1500, meaning we are able to put on a better display.

Now that we are in 2024, we plan to start renovations of the Scout Hut turning it into a community asset available to all of our villagers to be able to use for private events. We are waiting for the release of Section 106 monies from the Lodge Park development, which are now with Buckinghamshire Council. We applied for the funds in December 2023 and await them.

I hope to be able to update you all at our Annual Meeting on our progress.

# **3** Planning and Development

#### Neighbourhood Plan

After a very long gestation starting early in 2016, the Maids Moreton Neighbourhood Plan has finally completed its journey and was approved by the referendum held on 21 December 2023. The Plan now carries full weight in determining planning applications.

The result was 95% voting "Yes" to accept the plan with a turnout of 33%. Both the turnout and the proportion voting Yes were higher than the average for such votes. Thank you to all who took the time to vote.

#### Scott's Lane Fields (23/01306/APP)

We are waiting for this application to be determined by the Planning Officer. In the event it were to be approved, we have requested the recommendation be called in to the Committee

### Walnut Drive – Reserved Matters – (23/01636/ADP)

Jonathan Walton, the DWH community engagement consultant, has booked the Village Hall for 24 January 2024 to hold a public consultation event on the Walnut Drive application. He will come together with his specialist colleagues and run an exhibition and feedback event. There will be an open session in the afternoon starting around 2.30pm until 5pm then again from 6.30pm until 8pm.

We shall hold an open discussion meeting starting shortly after 8pm at which people can make their views on the consultation event known.

#### Moreton Rd 3

The planning consent was called by the Secretary of State and resulted in a review by a planning inspector, which was completed on 31 October. The Inspector's report has been sent to the Secretary of State for consideration and a decision will be issued on or before 4 March 2024.

The Beaver section has been very busy and joined the Cub section for a sleepover and skills event in September where, amongst the activities, we had to make vehicles from fruit and vegetables, learn how to iron and fold our scarves, how to use a potato peeler and knife safely, and how to set an alarm clock correctly. We also had to build a tower from wooden kebab sticks strong enough to hold a cup of water and had a glow stick disco. The section also had an evening where they made miniature canoes, this was after some of them saw that the Scout section had made a full-size canoe earlier in the year.

The Cub section has had a busy term including our annual chip shop hike, a firm favourite with all, a local knowledge hike around Maids Moreton, an astronomy evening and making robots. To get their DIY badges, they had to design their robot then, with support, saw the wood, use a drill, hammer, *etc*. The Cubs really enjoy making something and, with plenty of adults to supervise and careful planning, we did not need to use our First Aid skills! We also took our chef badge by making pizzas and houmous with crudities which looked very appetising. For our end of term evening, we went to an indoor climbing centre in Milton Keynes. It was wonderful to see both children and adults challenging themselves to have a go.

The Scout section have taken part in The Grymsdyke hike in the south of the County, which involves map reading and hiking; they finished second out of the whole County and completed the course in a faster time than last year. They have been to an indoor golf course in Milton Keynes and another favourite activity of making map cakes where they are given a map square to recreate in cake form so they have to plan what resources to use to best represent the features of the square. There was also a hike and overnight camp for the older Scouts in October around Milton Bryan near Woburn. The Scouts cooked their own food and, although it rained overnight, we survived.

The Group has also been raising funds by providing refreshments at the Maids Moreton Bonfire night, collecting with the Buckingham Table Santa Float and at the Christmas Parade.

We were also delighted to have a Leader represent the Group at the request of Her Royal Highness The Princess of Wales for the Carol Service in Westminster Abbey.

#### 10 News from Buckingham Rugby Union Football Club

#### Buckingham Rugby Club Winter Update 2024

As we start the New Year, the 2023-24 season is already more than halfway through and last year's World Cup in France is a distant memory. Improved performances by Buckingham men's First XV see them sitting comfortably mid-table in Counties 1, Southern North, including convincing victories over Milton Keynes, Rams IIIs and Bracknell IIs. Next up are games against Wallingford on 6<sup>th</sup> January at home and away to league leaders Beaconsfield on the 14<sup>th</sup> which could prove to be a difficult trip.

Swans Ladies First XV are in a league below the Premiership, which sees them travel as far afield as Manchester, Newcastle and Cheltenham. Although they have won only 3 of their 9 games so far in their league, they lost narrowly on the road to both Barnsley Ladies and Sale Ladies, so hopes are high that they can stay in the league for next season. Next up in January are games away to Bishop Auckland Ladies on the 7<sup>th</sup> and Cheltenham Tigers Women at home on the 14<sup>th</sup>.

The annual Harpers Day charity tournament took place on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> December, despite the extremely wet conditions over the festive break. Overall some 250 spectators watched four teams compete, which raised a very creditable £2,000. This year we have nominated the Buckingham Mayor's Charities as the beneficiary. The Mayor will use the donation to support Buckingham and Winslow Young Carers and the Buckingham Food Bank.

Meanwhile, the amendment to our previously approved application for 2 new changing rooms has now been passed by Buckinghamshire Council. Work is scheduled to start in May, with an anticipated 12 week build, so they should be complete for the start of the new season. The RFU have confirmed grant funding, acknowledging the strong status of our Ladies section. Other fundraising continues including regular Music and Comedy Nights and Age Group fundraising.

After last year's highly successful event, planning has already started for the 12<sup>th</sup> Buckingham Beer and Music Festival, which will be held on the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> July, where some 50 real ales and 20 ciders will be on offer. All Maids Moreton residents will be very welcome!
