## 4. Liaison updates

- a. PC
- i. The PC is still engaged with David Wilson Homes Community Coordinator. Rocky's path will be 3m wide with bollard lighting. There will be a dense tree plantation between Manor Park and the development.
- ii. Scotts Lane Fields -the applicant has asked the Council for an extension to the end of November for his documentation. Planning officer agreed to this and also said she was mindful to refuse the application.
- iii. NP 28<sup>th</sup> Sept The Independent Examiner has sent the NP to Bucks CC.
- iv. Bucks CC has 5 weeks from 2<sup>nd</sup> October to approve.
- v. If approval is granted, a referendum will then be organised which needs a simple majority to accept; if agreed NP would have priority over Local Plan.
